Abraham travels to a Mountain in Moriah

'Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love—Isaac—and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you."

Early the next morning Abraham got up and loaded his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. When he had cut enough wood for

the burnt offering, he set out for the place God had told him about. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance. He said to his servants, "Stay here with the donkey while I and the boy go over there. We will worship and then we will come back to you." Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and placed it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife.

As the two of them went on together, Isaac spoke up and said to his father Abraham, "Father?" "Yes, my son?" Abraham replied. "The fire and wood are here," Isaac said, "but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" Abraham answered, "God himself will provide the lamb for the burnt offering, my son." And the two of them went on together. When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. Then he reached out his hand and took the knife to slay his son.

But the angel of the LORD called out to him from heaven, "Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. "Do

not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son." Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horns. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son. So Abraham called that place The LORD Will Provide. And to this day it is said,

"On the mountain of the LORD it will be provided."



The angel of the LORD called to Abraham from heaven a second time and said, "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, I will surely bless you and make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore. 

Mountain Safety

Before you journey up any mountain it's very important to check the local safety guides. They will advise of you such things as: Tell someone where you are going; Check the weather forecast; Wear suitable clothing and footwear; Carry food and drink; Take the right equipment

with you, such as a map, compass, torch, mobile (can't always be relied upon), first aid kit, pen, paper, whistle, etc; Don't go alone; Have a back-up plan; Stay together (except in an emergency); Allow plenty of time to get off the mountain before dark; Go the pace of the slowest; Don't run down hills; Take your rubbish home with you, etc, etc. Enjoy mountains, but respect them and stay safe.

Mars' Hill / The Areopagus

'Now while Paul waited for them at Athens, his spirit was stirred within him when he saw the city wholly given to idolatry. Therefore he disputed in the synagogue with the Jews, and with the devout persons, and in the marketplace daily with those who met with him. Then certain philosophers of the Epicureans and of the Stoics encountered him. And some said, "What will this babbler say?" And some others said, "He seems to be a proclaimer of strange gods," because he preached unto them Jesus and the resurrection.

And they took him and brought him unto the Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new doctrine is whereof you speak? For you bring certain strange things to our ears, and we would know therefore what these things mean." (For all the Athenians and strangers who were there spent their time in nothing else than either telling or hearing some new thing.)

give up, he spied a shelter for tired pilgrims, built by the Lord of the Hill.'


