A Prayer Answered on the Moon

John Glenn was the first American to orbit the earth (in 1962). He went into space again in 1998 aged 77! He said: 'To look out at this kind of creation and not believe in God is to me impossible.'

In 1968, on the Apollo 8 mission, Frank Borman, Jim Lovell and Bill Anders were the first space crew to orbit the moon. Looking down on the earth from 250,000 miles away, they decided to share their 'feeling of closeness to the Creator of all things'. Borman, Lovell and Anders radioed back a message to nearly one billion people listening on earth, in turns they read all of Genesis chapter one: 'In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. . . .' As Borman later explained: 'I had an enormous feeling that there had to be a power greater than any of us, that there was a God and that there was indeed a beginning.'

Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin are well known as the first astronauts to land on the moon in 1969. However, not many people know that Aldrin's first act on the moon was to celebrate communion.

James Irwin went to the moon in 1971; On one occasion he was having a problem with an experiment on the moon's surface, so he decided to pray about it. He said 'God I need your help right now'. Suddenly the solution came to him and he felt God was with him, he even looked over his shoulder to see if God was standing right behind him! As a result of this experience Irwin left NASA and became what he called a 'goodwill ambassador for the Prince of Peace'. For about 20 years he travelled widely telling people that 'Jesus walking on the earth is more important than man walking on the moon.'

Charlie Duke, was the lunar module pilot on the 1972 Apollo 16 mission. He was the 10th person to walk on the moon. He wrote: 'A number of years after




James Irwin in 1971 with the Lunar Roving Vehicle.

my moonwalk, I began another walk — a walk with God. This experience is even more exciting than my first trip. It has exposed me to the supernatural and mighty power of God. But most exciting of all, it has led me from a life of continual striving and restlessness to one of peace and fulfilment.' He became active in mission work and said: 'I make speeches about walking ON the moon and walking WITH the Son [of God].'


dark clouds. The wind began to blow. Then a heavy rain began to fall.'

'After Jesus was born, some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is the baby who was born to be the king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east. We came to worship him." When King Herod heard about this new king of the Jews, he was troubled. And all the people in Jerusalem were worried too. Herod called a meeting of all the leading priests and teachers of the law. 


of Bethlehem in Judea. The prophet wrote about this in the Scriptures: 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are important among the rulers of Judah. A ruler will come from you. Did You Know














- 1) Arcturus (sometimes referred to as the Bear) is about 170 times more luminous than our sun! It's probably the 3rd brightest individual star in our night sky. It's big, it makes our sun look tiny! Arcturus is referred to in Job 38:32.
- 2) The Orion constellation is over 1,500 light years away. Currently 10 of its stars are believed to have planets. 'Orion's Belt' consists of three stars evenly spaced and in a straight line. Orion is mentioned in Job 38:31.
- 3) Each and every rain drop can create a rainbow, but for the human eye it needs millions of raindrops to combine their rainbows and create a big one for us to see it. The inside of a rainbow often appears brighter than the outside of a rainbow! A rare 'moonbow' is a rainbow produced by light from the moon. If a rainbow has a reflection the colours in the second rainbow are inverted. God explained to Noah the meaning of the rainbow (see Genesis 9:8-17).
- 4) The Pleiades cluster is about 444 light years away and contains over 1,000 stars, about 14 can be seen with naked eye. Pleiades is mentioned in Job 38:31.
- 5) A small minority of Bible translations translate a word in Amos 5:26 into 'Saturn'. Galileo Galilei, from Italy, discovered Saturn in 1610. Saturn's rings stretch out more than 120,000 km, but generally are only about 20 metres thick! 82 moons have been discovered around Saturn! Saturday gets its name from Saturn.
- 6) If the sun was empty it could hold over one million earths inside! It takes light millions of years to travel from the core of the sun to its surface, but then only 8 minutes and 20 seconds to reach the earth. The temperature at the centre of the earth is about 15 million degrees. Psalm 19:6 says nothing is hidden from the sun's heat.

Why Are You Looking into the Sky?

'Jesus said to them, "The Father is the only One who has the authority to decide dates and times. These things are not for you to know. But the Holy Spirit will come to you. Then you will receive power. You will be my witnesses — in Jerusalem, in all of Judea, in Samaria, and in every part of the world." After he said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up. A cloud hid him from their sight. As he was going, they were looking into the sky. Suddenly,



two men wearing white clothes stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing here looking into the sky? You saw Jesus taken away from you into heaven. He will come back in the same way you saw him go."
