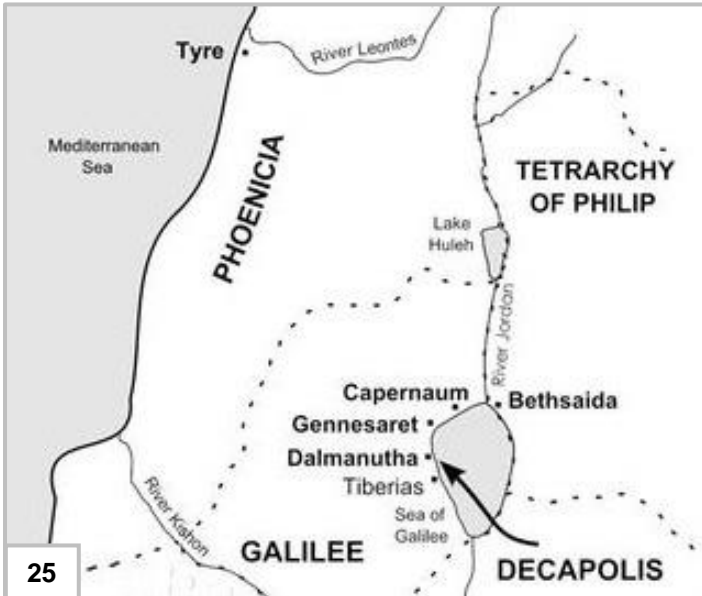
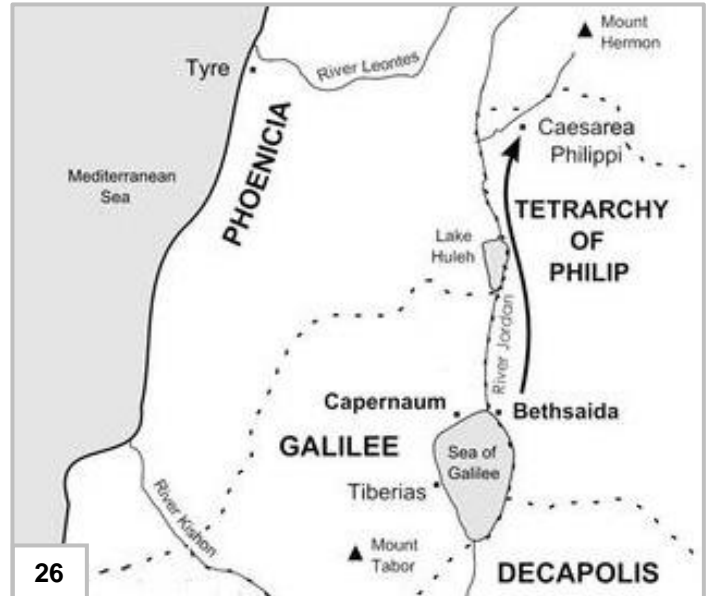

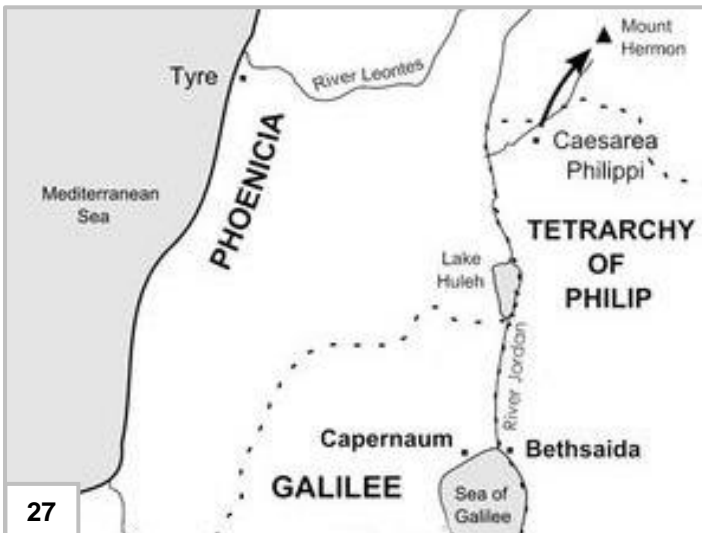
Journeys of Jesus Part 2



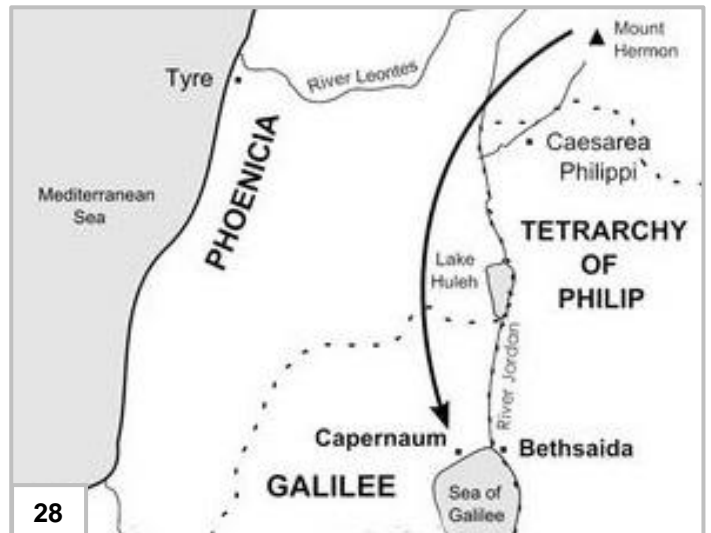
25. Jesus crosses the Sea of Galilee to Dalmanutha where He teaches the crowds. Mark 8:1-21



26. Jesus travels north to Caesarea Philippi where Peter declares that Jesus is the Messiah. Mark 8:27-30

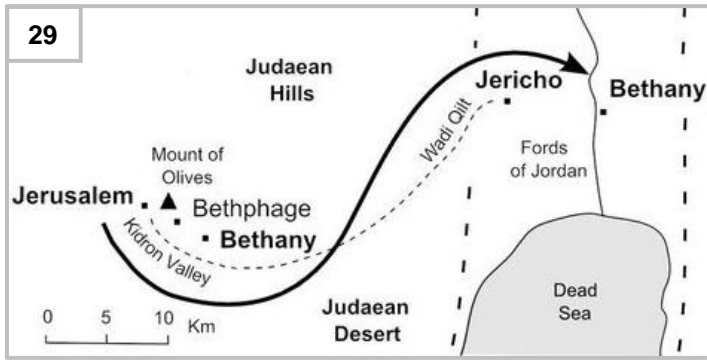


27. Jesus is seen talking with Moses and Elijah on a high mountain (maybe Mount Hermon?) Mark 9:2-13

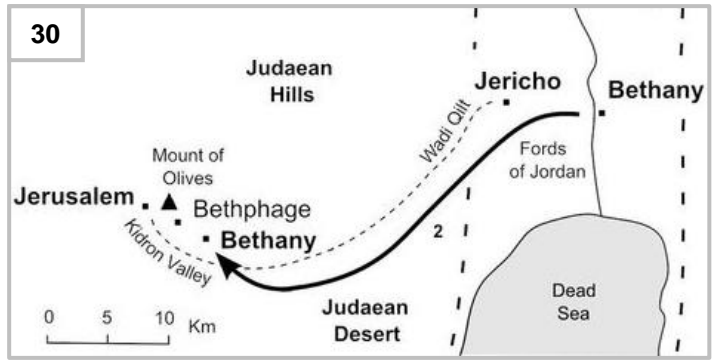


28. Jesus returns to Galilee where He teaches about His death and resurrection. Mark 9:30-32

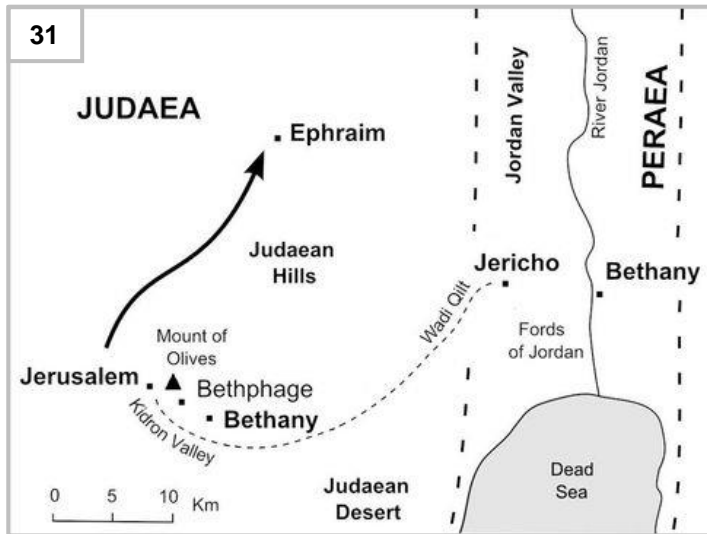




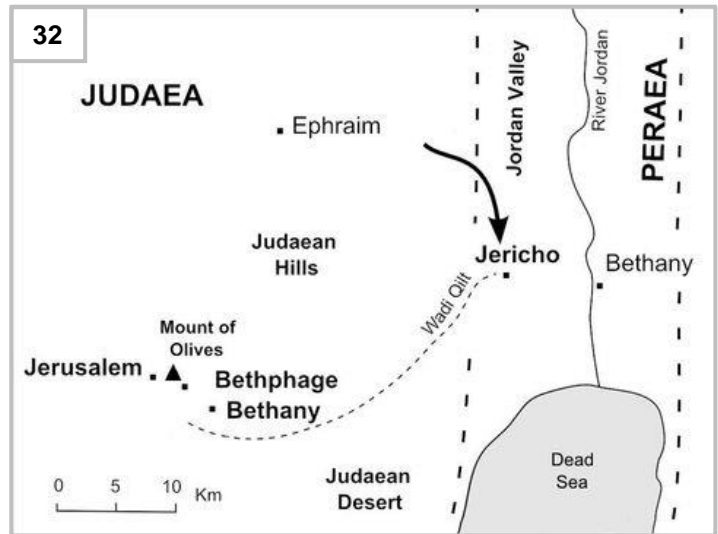
29. Jesus leaves Jerusalem and travels to where John had been baptising. Because of what John had said many believed in Jesus there. John 10:40-42



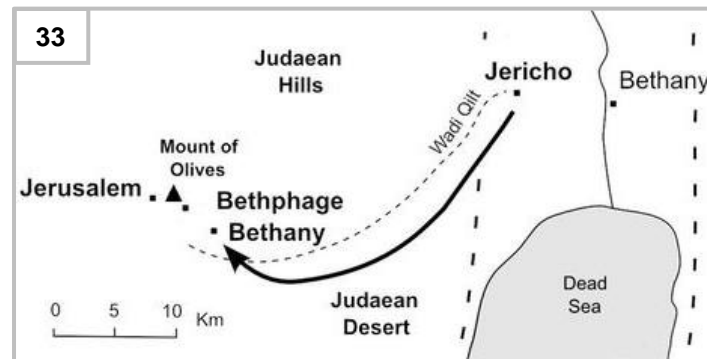
30. Hearing of the death of Lazarus, Jesus returns to Bethany and to Mary and Martha. After weeping with the sisters, Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. John 11:1-44



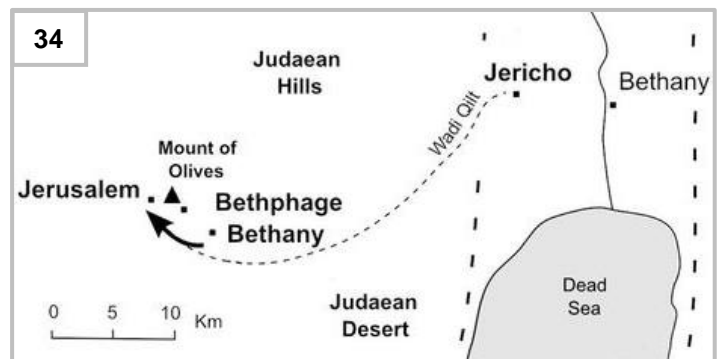
31. Jesus and His disciples no longer walk openly among the Jews. They withdraw to Ephraim to avoid being arrested by the chief priests. John 11:54



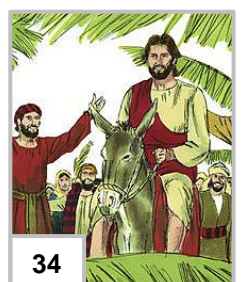
32. Jesus and His disciples come to Jericho. Blind Bartimaeus is sitting by the road begging. He asks Jesus for his sight and Jesus heals him. Mark 10:46-52

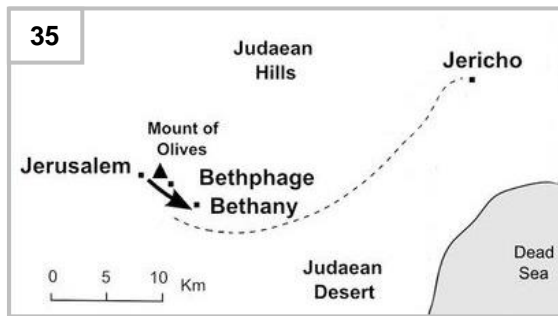


33. Jesus climbs the road from Jericho towards Jerusalem. He sends two disciples ahead to borrow a colt on which no one had sat. Mark 11:1-7

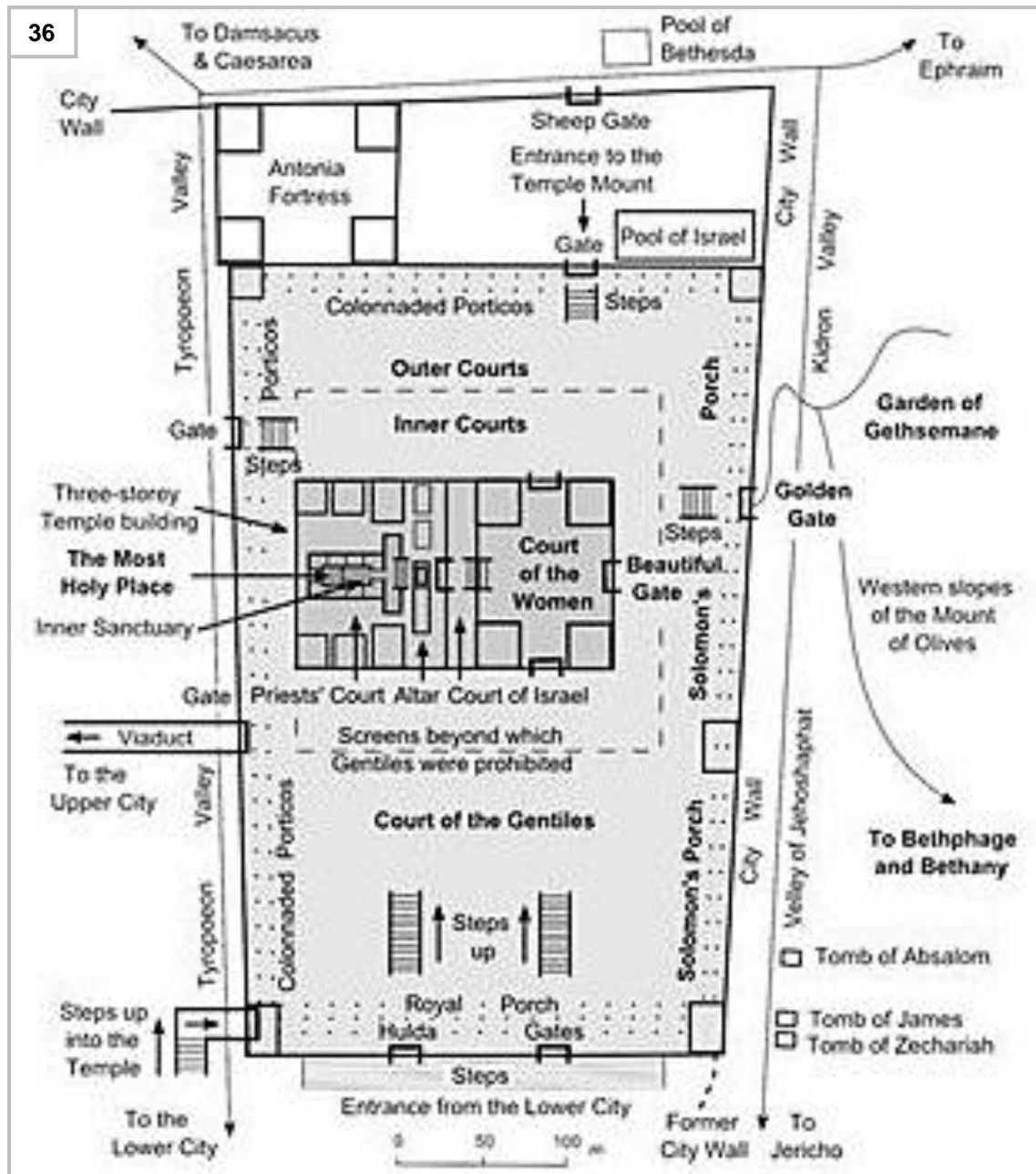


34. Jesus leaves Bethany and enters Jerusalem on a colt. 'Those who went before and those who followed cried out saying: "Hosanna"'. Mark 11:8-10, NKJV

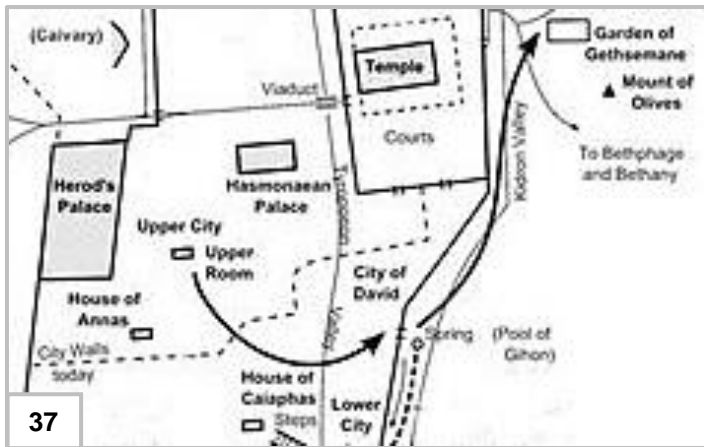




35. Jesus visits the Temple courtyard and looks around at all the things there, then He and the twelve disciples return to Bethany to stay overnight. Mark 11:11. The photograph on the right shows Bethany as it was about 100 years ago.

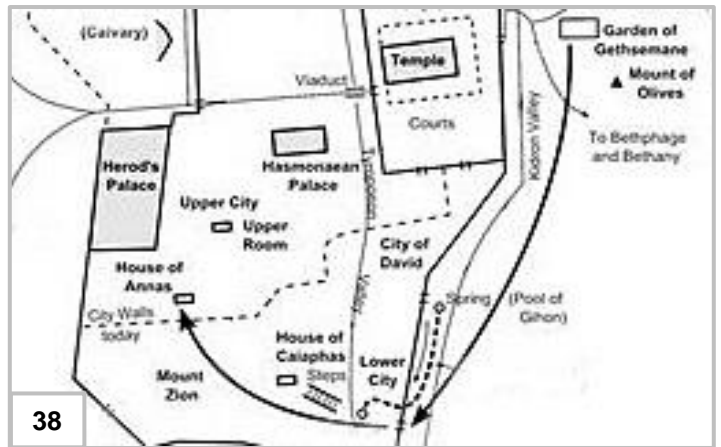


36. Jesus enters the outer courtyard of the Temple and drives out merchants who are selling doves, etc. Mark 11:15-17

37. After finishing their last supper together in the upper room, they sing a hymn. Then Jesus and His disciples cross the Kidron Valley to the Garden of Gethsemane on the Mount of Olives. Mark 14:17-42

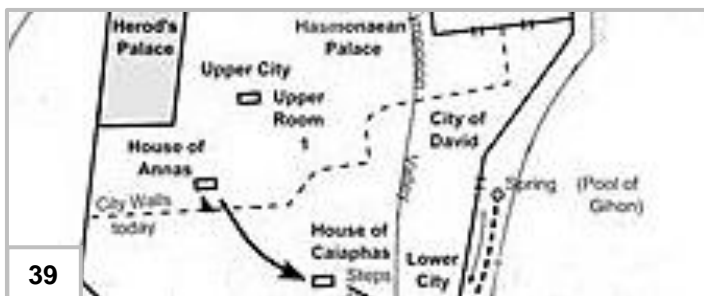
38. Jesus asks the crowd, 'Whom are you seeking?' They reply, 'Jesus of Nazareth'. Jesus said: 'I am He'. As He said this 'they drew back and fell to the ground'. They then arrested Jesus and took Him to Annas. John 18:3-13, NKJV

39. Jesus is taken to the Sanhedrin in the house of Caiaphas who asks Him: 'Are You the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?' Jesus answers 'I am'. Jesus is then accused of blasphemy. Mark 14:53-65, NKJV

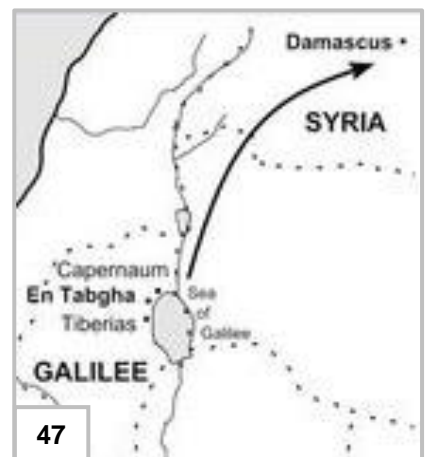
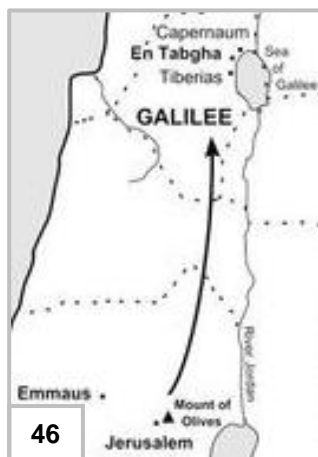
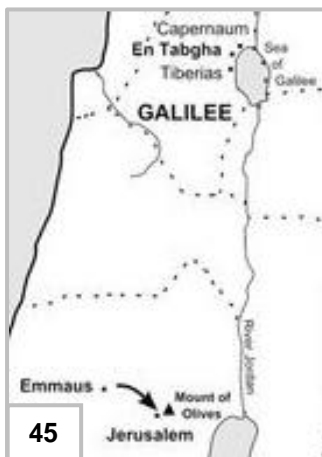
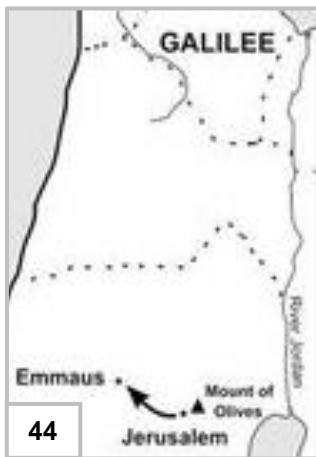
41. Pilate sends Jesus to Herod Antipas. Herod asks Jesus many questions, but Jesus stays silent. Herod's men treat Jesus with contempt. They dress Him in a 'royal robe' to make fun of Him. Luke 23:6-11, NLT



42. Jesus is then taken back to Pilate who washes his hands in water symbolising he is 'innocent of the blood of this just Person'. The crowd responds, let 'His blood be on us and on our children'. Matthew 27:11-25, NKJV



43. Jesus is scourged and taken outside the city gates to Golgotha where He is crucified. 'There stood by the cross of Jesus His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary, the wife of Cleopas, and Mary Magdalene.' John 19:25, NKJV



44. Jesus appears to Cleopas and another disciple as they walk the seven miles from Jerusalem to Emmaus. Luke 24:13-27
45. The two disciples rush back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples that they've seen the risen Lord. Luke 24:33-35
46. Jesus appears to His disciples by the Sea of Galilee and shortly afterwards they catch a 'multitude of fish'. John 21:1-6
47. As Saul approaches Damascus, Jesus appears to him and asks: 'Saul, Saul; why are you persecuting Me?' Acts 9:1
